We expect all our pupils to wear school uniform and believe it gives our school a smart appearance whilst allowing for a certain amount of individuality. We expect parents to support the school in this matter.

Pupils who arrive for school without the appropriate uniform will be provided with school uniform for the day.

The basic colours of our uniform are **Navy & Grey** with pale blue and white as secondary colours (for shirts and blouses). These colours are readily available at local retailers. This colour scheme will be reviewed by the School Council during 2018/9.

Warm winter coat – any colour	Rainmac – any colour / summer hat – no inappropriate logos
Plain black, flat, sensible shoes <i>Please note: trainers and / or canvas shoes are not acceptable – pupils will be required to change their footwear if they wear trainers to school.</i>	Plain black, flat, sensible shoes – as per cold weather uniform Sensible strong sandals – no flip flops or footwear that could cause a child to trip.

Unacceptable items of dress/ appearance

Logos other than RLJS logo	Leggings
Denim clothing	Footwear other than listed above
Track suits other than for PE / games	Make up & nail varnish
Trainers and canvas shoes	
Jewellery & body piercings other than 1 small stud per ear and / or a modest wrist watch Please note: valuable items of jewellery must not be worn to school	Hair braids, colourings, excessive hair styling including lines unless integral to a child's cultural identity

If pupils are not appropriately dressed for school that pupil will be reminded of our uniform guidelines and a letter may be sent home. If a child is not wearing appropriate footwear they will be asked to change into their PE pumps or be provided with a pair of black pumps to wear for the day. In extreme cases we will contact parents and ask them to collect their child and return them appropriately dressed, or bring suitable clothing.
